- Covid Update- We are continuing to remind children of the need for good hygiene and sneezing procedures and are ensuring that we ventilate classrooms by opening doors and windows. Those who wish to continue wearing masks will be supported. Please ensure that sick children stay at home as there are still cases in our community and anything we can do to prevent the spread of

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illnesses as a school community will benefit all our students, staff and whanau.

- Safety Reminders—All crossing of George Crescent must be done at the patrolled crossing. (Parents you need to be good role models for this!) Parents have the responsibility of ensuring the safety of children crossing the main road. If children are riding their bikes to school they should be at least 10 years old (recommendation from NZ Police, Bike Wise and LTNZ) and must wear an approved helmet. They should be riding the bike on the road not the footpath. Any younger children must be supervised by a parent.
- SCHOOL BEGINS AT 8.55a.m. at the ringing of the hand bell. Parents are asked to say their final farewells at this time and depart from rooms so that teaching can begin promptly at 9 a.m. Late children interrupt the class so please ensure your children are at school prior to the handbell.
