Indoor Exhibits: Students are asked to complete 8 exhibits.

All baking is to be done at home and brought to school on Friday 22 September.

All flowers, containers etc need to be brought to school and <u>completed at school</u> on Friday 22 September.

Art:

Students will complete three pieces of work at school. All 3 pieces must be entered.

- * Pastel Pop Art
- * Friedensreich Hundertwasser inspired painting
- * Tile Art Printing inspired by Nature

Floral Exhibits: Choose 3 of the following:

- Arrangement in an unusual container
- Foliage Arrangement in a vase (i.e. no flowers)
- New Zealand Native Arrangement
- A table centrepiece (margarine container size with florist oasis, a candle, foliage and flowers, no higher than 25 cm you need to see see the person across the table from you when you are eating)

Baking: Choose 2 of the following:

- Story Book Cupcakes 3 decorated cupcakes on a small plate that have a 'story book' theme
- Pizza Face 1 mini pizza (no more than 15 cm in diameter) on a small plate decorated as a 'face'
- Decorated Cookie 1 cookie (no more than 10cm in diameter) on a small plate decorated (any theme)

(All baking must be covered with plastic film)

<u>Animal</u>: If you choose to raise and show an animal, it will be one of the following:

Calf rearing

Lamb rearing

Goat rearing

Chicken rearing

Project Topic: Wind Chimes - using natural or recycled materials.

You have the term to complete this project. Sheet attached.

This is compulsory for everyone, except pupils who have an animal for Agricultural Day.

<u>Garden Competition</u> - This is separate to Agricultural day and only open to those who DO NOT have animals.

You may choose to plant and raise a vegetable or flower garden. The gardens will be judged separately in November and prizes awarded at the end of the year.

2023 Agricultural Day Project

Children who have calves, lambs, goats and chickens **<u>DO NOT</u>** have to complete this project as time during Term 3 should be spent working on and caring for your animals.

<u>All other children</u> from Year 4 up who do not have an animal for Agricultural Day **are expected** to complete the following project. Year 3 students may complete the project if they like.

Wind Chimes Use of Natural or Recycled Materials

Part One:

Research and design a plan for what you think would be a great wind chime to hang up at your home. Think about the materials you will use (either natural or recycled - or a mixture of both.) Is your selection of materials going to be reasonably weatherproof and make a sound when the wind blows (without breaking if the wind is strong)?

You need to consider

- the shape and size of your wind chime
- where you will hang it at home
- how you will hang it?

Explain why you have made these decisions and where you will hang it at home.

This information needs to be presented in an attractive and accurate way. You can choose the means of presentation e.g. chart, booklet, poster, powerpoint, brochure, mobile, etc. Include photos of you working through the steps in making your wind chime as well. **This must be handed in with your wind chime and will be considered by the judge alongside your finished wind chime.**

Part Two:

Collect the natural or recycled materials that you have decided to use for your wind chime. Complete your design plan and make your wind chime.

The wind chime should be no bigger than 60cm square (but may be smaller.)

Part Three: Bring your finished wind chime and brief to school during the week before AG day. No later than Friday 22 September as this is the day they will be judged.
