I would like to congratulate all of our students for their efforts during this term. Well done to all who have represented the school at sports events, including AIMs games and for the success at the Franklin Mathex competition of all our teams but particularly our Year 7 team who won the competition. A great achievement for a small school. Congratulations to all students for the hard work in the preparation of animals, projects and classroom work for our Ag Day.

We acknowledge the recent passing of one of our Launchpad teachers, Mr Sweetsur. He gave years of service to our school and local community, and he will be greatly missed. A ceremony was held at school to recognise his contributions to our students.

Thank you also to our staff, including support staff, for their hard work during this term, keeping as much face time as possible through winter and for your work in preparing for our Ag Day. We hope you all enjoy your break and look forward to another busy but fulfilling Term 4.

#### **HEALTH & SAFETY**

Covid-19 is still in the community and we will continue to be affected by it for some time.

Thanks for your continued efforts in keeping our staff and students safe and well. Please keep sick children at home to avoid any spread of infections. Hand washing/sanitising is still a priority for everyone at school. The Ministry of Education has installed automatic air monitors in some rooms so the quality of air can be monitored and where necessary doors and windows opened.

For Term 4 sun protection is a priority as we have more outdoor activities – sun hats are required at school when outdoors and rash tops are mandatory for swimming, which will commence again in Term 4 once the weather improves. A small number of tops are available for an emergency loan, however children need to bring their own as part of their swimming gear. Also please make sure that your child uses sunscreen each day.

#### STUDENT ENGAGEMENT

We are happy to report that for those students whose attendance is regular, we are seeing excellent engagement in their learning and this engagement is helping them to make steady progress.

The basic subjects; reading, writing and mathematics are prioritised but we are also very aware of providing a balanced programme that caters for all students' needs, abilities and aspirations. This term there has been a focus on visual art and we hope you enjoy the displays in classrooms during Agricultural Day as students and staff have worked hard to get these completed.

Next term music will be an art priority. This will start with a musical instrument show for all students on 16 October. Our PE focus will be athletics and we hope that as many parents and whanau as possible attend the school and Franklin events. We have planned gymnastic lessons at the Pukekohe Gymnastic club for Year 0 - 2 students and these will start on 6 November.

Camps for Year 5 to Camp Adair and for Year 6 - 8 at Peter Snell, Whangaparaoa will also be highlights for students.

Individual reports will be sent home again at the end of the year. Parents are encouraged to contact your child's teacher if you have any questions/concerns.
