### PROPERTY UPDATE



You may be aware that in the last few months there have been a number of schools reported in the media that are needing major work done to keep them operating. This has caused the Ministry to reassess all of their current projects because they are overcommitted for this financial year. Unfortunately for us this has meant that our new two classroom block has been

pushed out a full year. While this is a great disappointment for the school there is nothing we can do but wait.

As we have been putting off a number of projects while this was to be completed, we are now looking to pull a few forward ASAP. The tractor through the front fence wasn't one of them!

We have just had a number of heat pumps installed and replaced the fence along the Buckland Road boundary. We are shortly having some concrete work done and installing a school wide Wifi network.

A few have asked about the Multipurpose Centre we have been planning for. This is still a priority for the school but at this stage the MoE are not allowing any funding to be allocated towards those types of projects. We are still working behind the scenes to get this project off the ground.

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### COMMUNITY SURVEY 2015 - The community has spoken!

Thank you – more than half, 87 of our 168 school families, found the time and energy to answer our Survey! We really appreciate your effort - we all know how crazy life can be!

Analyse It: We're currently collating and analysing the data so we can present it in an easy-to-read way.

**Action Plan:** We'll develop this based on "things that can be tackled now" and "things that require a longer-term approach".

Report Back to Community: We'll do this both via another newsletter and make it available on our BoT webpage.

#### A wee sneak preview...

Overwhelmingly the majority of you think Buckland School is doing a great job in most of the areas we surveyed! Some of the strongest feedback was about the 'Bible in Schools' programme - 20 families (24% of respondents) either 'disagree' or 'strongly disagree'. We will be considering whether to hold a specific 'referendum' on this as a result. Don't worry it won't cost us \$26m!

Homework, especially Mathletics – whilst the vast majority (94% of respondents) 'agree' or 'strongly agree' with Mathletics, there were some very interesting comments about the ad hoc-ness of tasks on Mathletics and requests for more visible math's homework, and other valid comments about homework in general.

There were some fantastic positive comments, and some very well-considered ideas where you see room for improvement. We look forward to working hard on these and sharing more about our survey this term.
