COMMUNITY SURVEY...

It was an excellent survey outcome overall which recognised the outstanding job that our amazing team do here at Buckland.

There were such a high number of great results in each category (over 90% agree/strongly agree!) that in order to focus on the *amazing* results, we've identified here the <u>Standouts!</u> that achieved over 95% agree/strongly agree. And although the numbers are small, we've identified any questions that received more than 10% disagree/strongly disagree as <u>Work on's</u>, so we can consider how to improve these areas over time.

There were also some great quality, considerate comments made with lots of positive reinforcement and constructive ideas.

We identified that many respondent's answered "don't know" or commented they weren't aware what happened in a particular area. So we can do some work on improving our communication and information availability in the future.

Standouts! (more than 95% agree/strongly agree)

- Student effort/achievement well recognised
- Teachers are approachable/willing to discuss child's needs
- **EOTC** is important
- We feel welcome at school
- Parents/whanau encouraged to attend school events/activities
- Mathletics useful tool (94%)
- Our child feels safe at school
- Clear safety expectations
- Programmes develop positive social skills
- H&S programmes adequate and effective
- Traffic addressed proactively

Work-on's (more than 10% disagree/strongly disagree)

- 'Bible in Schools' (24%)
- Good variety music/art opportunities (14%)
- Te Reo/Tikanga successfully integrated (13%)
- Reports give clear picture re generally; behaviourally/socially (17%)
- Homework basics at satisfactory level (16%)
- Class blogs would be useful (15%)
- We feel comfortable raising issues (12%)
- Reports give clear indication how we can help at home (11%)
- Reports give clear picture re National Stds (10%)
- Conflict/tensions dealt with effectively (15%)
- Bullying/violence dealt with effectively (12%)

Your valuable feedback has already being worked on this term with the Bible in Schools survey conducted, and homework policies have been reviewed by staff. We've also got some exciting initiatives in place for improving our Te Reo and Tikanga at Buckland next year. We will continue to refer to your responses from the survey throughout next year, and particularly when we review our schools Strategic Plan early in the new year.

PROPERTY UPDATE

Great news! Our new classroom block has been scheduled to start near the end of January. This will mean some disruption for the beginning of the school year but plans are in place to keep this to a minimum.

We would like to thank the PTA for donations fowards a number of items including more shade gazebos, a drinking fountain and as the junior play ground will need to be relocated due to the new build they have donated towards upgrading from bark to a soft landing product. This will be a great addition to the school.

We have just completed some new concrete paths across the school and new fencing to the Buckland road boundary.

We will see some exciting and interesting developments so bring on 2016!!

BIBLE IN SCHOOLS SURVEY...

Thank you to all of those families who responded to the follow-up Bible in Schools survey.

We received a very pleasing 61% response rate. Of those that responded, 78% were in support of retaining Bible in Schools, with 22% not supporting the continuation of this programme.

As indicated within the survey newsletter, with more than 60% of the votes being in favour of keeping the programme, we will continue with this and consult with the community again in three years' time.
