Looking Ahead to 2017

We are looking forward to seeing a greater focus on the Junior and Senior syndicates with the Board endorsing both our Deputy Principal's being released from their classrooms for 3 days a week—Angela Lindgreen and Marlene Fletcher.

This will enable them to put greater emphasis on their Senior Management duties within their syndicates, and target some key areas such as transition (pre-school to primary, and intermediate to secondary).

We have employed additional staff to ensure these classrooms continue to provide our kids with the best possible learning environment.

At the December Board meeting your Board reluctantly agreed to review the level of school donations we request of our families in 2017.

Our donations have remained lower than any other local school at \$50 per child per year—for the last 10 years since our school uniforms were introduced in 2006!

2017 donations will be: \$75 – one child, \$150 – two children, \$180 – three or more children.

These funds enable us to support the many various extracurricular activities and ensure that throughout the year we are keeping requests for additional money to a minimum.

And don't forget that you can claim back a third of all donations from IRD as a tax rebate.
