The Buckland School Board of Trustees comprises five parents, one staff representative and the Principal. Elections for the board take place every three years. We're half way through our current Board term, next election is June 2019. The Board of Trustees meets in the school conference room, as near as possible to the second Wednesday of every month during term time. Board meetings are open for anyone to attend, but they are not public meetings. This means members of the public may attend, but do not have speaking or voting rights and will be asked to leave when the board goes into committee.

The responsibility of the Board is that of governance (control or authority) and an overview of management of the school. The Board is responsible for ensuring that legal obligations are met and that all resources (people, property or financial) are managed in compliance with relevant legislation and in the best interests of the school. The school's Charter and Annual Plan reflect specific needs and priorities. The Board sets strategic long term goals, develops and reviews policies. Daily management of the school is the responsibility of the Principal. The Board is not involved with the day to day management of school activities.
