Mathematic Bubbles

Dear Parents

Attached (or in your child's book) you will find the Maths Bubbles that will show the knowledge and strategies your child is learning in the **Number** strand of Mathematics. (They may have more than one stage attached if they are working across a couple of stages.) The amount of Number they do (each term) will vary from student to student depending on their needs.

These "Bubbles" are used in all classes so that students know what they are working on and what they have yet to achieve in Number. As children progress through the stages, the stages cover more concepts and take longer for the children to achieve. Sometimes children will be on the same stage for two or more years.

Mathematics also includes – Geometry, Measurement and Statistics strands.

KNOWLEDGE

The Knowledge bubbles are what the children need to learn "off by heart." They are considered to be mastered when children can get them totally correct and are confident with them. When they are mastered the children are expected to be able to answer questions about them within 4 seconds (approximately.)

They will use this knowledge to help them with Strategy.

The Knowledge "Bubbles" are the areas that parents can help most at home with.

STRATEGY

Strategy is the way the children solve problems ... the way they think and the methods they use to get their answer. There is not the same need for speed with Strategy.

A Guide to year levels – Approximate Stages (as always there will be variations in student achievement)

By the end of: Year 1 – Stage 3

Year 2 - Stage 4

Year 4 – Stage 5

Year 6 - Stage 6

Year 8 – Stage 7/8

If you want to know more please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher.

It is important to return these Bubbles/Books back to school the next day.
