Agricultural Day Notices

- Calf Section—due to Mycoplasma bovis special precautions will be in place on Ag Day. These include spacing of calves in a roped off area that only competitors can enter. There must be no touching of calves by anyone else.
- Dogs in Playground–No dogs are allowed at school on Ag Day.
- No Smoking—Please be aware the school grounds are smoke free areas and smoking will not be permitted at any times including Agricultural Day.
- Security on Ag Day—Please ensure your cars are locked and valuables are not left unattended.
- Trucks are not able to use the school driveway.
- Agricultural Day Indoor Section—children and teachers nearly have all art work completed. Floral arrangements (as per the requirements sent home early in the term) will be made at school on Friday. These must be children's work. If arrangements come assembled they will be dismantled and children will need to do their own work. Any parents coming to assist in classes must not do the work for children. Please assist in a room your child is not in. It is important that we are fair to all children.
- **Roll Call** –the bell will ring at 9a.m. for children to report to their teachers in front of their classrooms on Saturday.
- Mufti Day—children can wear mufti on Ag Day.

Group Day Group Day for calves, lambs and goats will be held at the Franklin A & P Showgrounds on Wednesday 23 October. Entry is open to any child who has shown an animal at our Agricultural Day. Entries close on Tuesday 15 October. The fee is \$5.00 and must accompany the entry form. The Group does not accept late entries. Entry forms are available on the school website under Agricultural Day or from the office noticeboard. Please place forms in the locked drawer in the office foyer.
