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Community Survey Response:

Thank you to the 59 families that responded to the Board of Trustees. The Board is elected to reflect the views of the community to which the School belongs. The full results of the survey are available on the School Notice board.

The results were generally positive, but three highlights from the survey are;

- Health and EOTC programmes are seen as appropriate
- Community participation in the school is encouraged
- The Classrooms are seen as caring places with students with additional needs included

Some issues raised, that the board is keen to help with include;

Whanau are comfortable raising issues / concerns:

The school has an open policy and robust measures for reporting concerns. However, focus will be on improving the communication of these policies and avenues available for people to be listened to.

Te Reo Maori integration and time on Sport is appropriate:

With community responses ranging from too much time is spent on one activity or another, to not enough time is spent on the same activities respectively it will be difficult to meet all expectations. The School will continue to offer a wide range of curriculum and cocurricular opportunities meeting obligations and more from the NZ curriculum.

The school supports children to manage relationships and conflicts are dealt effectively by staff:

In the modern education environment, the demands on the school and staff are high and increasing. The school and the Board of Trustees are engaging in creating a new values system, designed with input from the students, based on respect, resilience and responsibility. The aim is to create an environment where these values are supported by all parties in the school and community.

Swimming Pool:

New shade sails have been purchased for around the pool area. It is compulsory for students to wear sun safe rash tops when swimming in the pool.

Donations:

Decile 1-7 schools can opt into a new scheme after consultation with their communities for 2020. As we are Decile 8 we do not meet the criteria for this option, therefore we will continue to ask for voluntary donations.
