Whanau and Community Members

- ♦ We had a wonderful week last week and children enjoyed the opportunity to reconnect with their friends and teachers. Thank you for the way you prepared your children for their return to school and for the way you are handling the drop offs and pickups. After Monday we were able to organise times for siblings to join younger children at the end of the day. Thanks to parents for the prompt pickups, this has definitely helped with the congestion at the school gate and also helped with the social distancing that adults are supposed to be doing.
 - Morning Drop offs Under Alert Level 2 we will continue with the drop offs being as close to 8.55 a.m. as possible and no earlier than 8.30a.m. (Unless arrangement has been made with principal. Children must enter at either of the two George Crescent gates. Parents, unfortunately you will not be able to enter the school except in extreme cases. Teachers will continue to be out the front to welcome your children. Children will make their way straight to their classrooms, sanitize hands, and will have activities to occupy them prior to the start of the school day.
 - Afternoon Staggered Pickups **2.30p.m.** for Piwakawaka plus older siblings., **2.40p.m.** for Titipounamu and Ruru and older siblings. **2.50p.m.** for Yr 3 & 4, (plus siblings) **3.00p.m.** for rest of children. We would like all children to have left by 3.15p.m. The patrolled crossing will operate. Please try to keep your distance from the staff who will be on duty. There will be no Walking School Bus until further notice.
- ◆ Adult Visits to School—If you absolutely need to visit the school you must do so through the office. We will only be allowing one person into the office at a time and you will be required to wait behind the red line until you are invited in. You will be required to sign in and record where you have come from and where you are going to. You will need to confirm that you are well and have no COVID -19 symptoms and have not been in contact with anyone who has the virus. This is a requirement under Alert Level 2.

- School will be closed on Monday 1 June to observe the Queen's Birthday.
- Soap & Hand Sanitizer—with the increase in use of these items some children's hands are getting sore. If this is the case for your child please do not hesitate to send their own soap or sanitizer with them to use at school.
- ◆ Alert Level 2 Guidelines for our school—these are on our website in the COVID-19 folder. If you have any queries/questions please phone me.

Some Key messages we have been asked to pass on to our school community by the Ministry of Education:

- Our schools are safe. Even though there is such a low risk of the virus getting in the school gates to start with, we will be keeping up our hygiene practices and other public health measures as an extra precaution for as long as we're at Alert Level 2
- The return to school has gone really smoothly and it has been brilliant to see how excited the children have been to get back to their learning and social routines
- We know some of our families are still feeling a bit anxious about sending their children back to school, which is understandable given everything we have been through these past 2 months
- It's really important children do return to school, not just for their education but also their health and wellbeing
- Instances of Covid-19 in New Zealand are very low

We're aware of concerns out there that people without symptoms may be able to spread the virus. The Ministry of Health has advised us that there is no instance in New Zealand of someone spreading the virus without ever having symptoms.
