- After today's announcement it looks at though we will be in Alert Level 4 for another two weeks! Hopefully Auckland numbers will continue to decline and an earlier decision might be made. In the meantime our school site is closed. There is no access to school sites during Alert Level 4. Playgrounds (including public playgrounds) are also closed to reduce the risk of the virus spreading.
- School Values: Respect—Kia u, Responsibility—Kia manawanui, Resilience— Kia mau (I hope children are exhibiting these at home and giving support to all their family members.)
- Sports and School Events—Until further notice all sport and school events will be suspended. AIMS games are cancelled for this year.
- Devices and Hard Packs—We made up and delivered further hardpacks and devices today. These will be the last for this week. Can I please remind children and their parents that devices must be treated with respect and care and as per the agreement used for learning activities only. Last week we saw that a few children were abusing this agreement and were shut out of programmes they were on by teachers. No food or drink must be near devices and chargers must be used carefully. If you need help with learning activities please email your child's teacher.
