- COVID Update—School Cases: We continue to have Covid cases and those needing to isolate popping up in <u>all</u> classrooms across the school. If you are concerned about the health of your children please keep them at home, test and report their absence to the office. We are having to report student cases to the Ministry of Education each day so it is important that we know if your child is COVID positive. The Ministry of Education have provided us with masks and RAT tests for children. If we are concerned about your child we will give one to you when we send students home. Please request a test if you have concerns and are unable to obtain one.
- Freeing up some of our school procedures: Children will now be able to play outdoors across all areas of the school. We will also be able to have some outdoor gatherings under the new legislation. Masks, ventilation, hygiene actions, staying at home if unwell are still critical to mitigating the risks to students and staff.
- New Zealand remains at Red. (Cabinet is to review the framework colour level today.) After consultation with the Board of Trustees and the staff it has been decided that we will continue with the procedures to mitigate the risks to staff and students by <u>not</u> yet allowing parents onto the school site or into classrooms. Should a meeting between parents and teachers be necessary this will be able to take place and will be arranged for out of school hours. Masks will be compulsory. We all want to reconnect but at this stage we feel that the best thing for our students is having FaceTime in the classroom with their full time teacher. We will review the Health and Safety plan and reconnect school and community when we are able to do so safely.
