Pukekohe Town Centre Improvements

Auckland Transport are proposing improvements to make Pukekohe town centre safer for people walking and driving. In the town centre vehicles have priority, and drivers are not required to stop and give way to pedestrians. We think for a town centre, we can do better to make our roads safe for everyone. We have also developed a proposal to install new traffic signals at two intersections in town. We explored alternatives to traffic signals, listened to community experience and used sophisticated traffic surveys and population predictions before recommending change is needed for safety and future growth. What are the proposals?

Proposal 1: Convert existing raised tables into zebra crossings on: Seddon Street, King Street, Queen Street, and West Street King Street and Edinburgh Street. Proposal 2: Install new raised zebra crossings on: Edinburgh Street, Stadium Street, and Tobin Street Edinburgh Street, Massey Street, Westley Street. Proposal 3: Install traffic signals on Stadium Drive and East Street Proposal 4: Install traffic signals on Stadium Drive and East Street Proposal 4: Install traffic signals on King Street, Stadium Drive, Massey Avenue, and Manukau Road.
