- This week is **Maori Language** week. We will be celebrating by using te reo Maori in our classes as much as possible. Here are some ways you can join in at home: **Learn some new words**—Try to learn at least a dozen Maori words over the week. Correct your pronunciation—If you're not sure how to pronounce a word, ask a Māori friend or look it up online. There are several videos up on YouTube that can help you through this. Watch television-Watch a Māori children's show with your children and encourage them to repeat the words and phrases.

BUCKLAND SCHOOL Out of Zone Enrolments 2023

The Board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their children at Buckland School in 2023. Enrolment at Buckland School is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

The Board has determined we have a limited number of spaces for out of zone students. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone. If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available students will be selected by ballot. Application forms for out of zone places (available from the office and school website) must be received by **Friday 30 September 2022.** Ballot date if required 19 October 2022.

Parents of students who live within the home zone should also apply by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year.
