Attendance

The Education Review Office has just released a report on attendance with some concerning statistics. Actearoa New Zealand attendance rates are falling and are worse than in other comparable countries. In 2022 primary school regular attendance (more than 90% and less than a week off school a term) fell to 42 percent. This is concerning, because the evidence is clear that regular attendance is really important for learning, wellbeing, and life outcomes. A day here and there adds up to a lot! Learners who miss **a week** of school each term will have missed out on **a year** of schooling by the time they are 16.

For Buckland School last year we had only 60% of our children with regular attendance (more than 90%) a further 26% attended more than 80% and up to 90%) while 8% were moderately absent (attending more than 70% up to 80% with 6% of our students chronically absent (attending 70% or less.)

Attendance matters at Primary School—Establishing regular attendance routines early in children's schooling is important. How often learners go to school in early primary school predicts how much they will attend in secondary school. Primary school lays the foundations for future learning as learners develop the skills that are important for being successful in secondary school.
