- weren't we lucky with the weather? Ag Day was a wonderful opportunity to highlight our school and the work of our students to the wider community. A HUGE thank you to all parents, community members, local businesses for the fantastic support with sponsorship, contributions to raffles, the silent auction, stalls, produce and cakes, etc. The day was only possible because of the commitment of our school community and the countless hours put in by our children, staff, PTA members, the wonderful stall holders (and their families,) those who organised animal rings, tents, chairs and tables, prizes/gifts etc.
- Thanks also to the great team who worked tirelessly on Friday getting produce and stalls ready, assisting with children and preparing classrooms. Thanks also to those who stayed for the clean-up on Saturday and to past families and students who offered their help and stepped in to fill roster gaps for us.
- A special thanks to the children, their parents and staff for the way they prepared their animals and participated in the indoor activities. Classrooms looked stunning and children and staff should be very proud of the achievements.
- Thanks to Mrs Mills and Ryan Mills, for the efficient organisation of the animal side: organising the programme, judges, roster, ribbons, points, trophies, etc.
- Thanks to our indoor and animal judges for their input into our day and to those who were involved as stewards.
- ◆ A prior notice of a teacher strike has been notified for Thursday 23 October. This may or may not go ahead—the NZEI must confirm this three days prior. Our school will remain open for instruction either way. Monday 27 October is Labour day and Tuesday 28 October is an approved Teacher Only Day for Mathematics Professional Development.

- ◆ Safety Reminders—All crossing of George Crescent must be done at the patrolled crossing. (Parents you need to be good role models for this!) Parents have the responsibility of ensuring the safety of children crossing the main road. If children are riding their bike to school they should be at least 10 years old (recommendation from NZ Police, Bike Wise and LTNZ) and must wear an approved helmet. Any younger children must be supervised by a parent.
- Term 3 Attendance results: Only 73% of our students attended regularly (90% or more, which is less than 5 days absence) over the term. We are aware that there was a lot of sickness over the term and also a lot of students absent for holidays in term time, but this was still a disappointing statistic for our school. The Ministry have a target of 80% of students attending regularly—we exceeded this in Term 1 but not in Term 2 or 3. Let us hope that we can make (or exceed the target) in Term 4. Every Day Counts!!!
- ◆ School Begins at 8.55a.m. Parents are asked to say their final farewells at the handbell and depart from rooms so that teaching can begin promptly. Last term only 80% of our students were on time for class! Late children interrupt the class so please ensure your children are at school prior to the handbell at 8.50a.m. Our rolls are marked at 8.55a.m. so our maths and literacy programmes can begin at 9 a.m.
- Dates for the Term—These are on the back, please put them in a safe place. They are also available on our Website calendar.
- Hats—these are to be worn this term. There are supplies available from the uniform shop that is open on Monday mornings from 8.30a.m to 9.15am. Thanks to Mrs Thompson for running this for us. Please name all items of clothing so they can be handed back if lost.
- Dates for 2026—The Board has approved the following dates for 2026: Term 1—Tuesday 3 February—Thursday 2 April. Term 2—Mon 20 April—Friday 3 July. Term 3—Monday 20 July—Friday 25 September. Term 4—Monday 12 October—Tuesday 15 Dec. Please make holiday arrangements during holiday times so school attendance is not disrupted. Ag Day is planned for 26 September. (TBC) Waitangi Day is Fri 6 Feb. Easter falls in the Term 1 holiday break. Anzac Day is Sat 25 April with Mon 27 observed. King's Birthday is 1 June, Matariki—is in the Term 2 holiday break, Labour Day—Mon 26 October.

- School Council Casual Dress Day—Last term made \$230.30 for St John. Thanks to all who made donations to this cause. Reminder: a defibrillator is available at school on the wall outside the office.
- Ag Day Cups & Trophies—please return all cups and trophies won at Ag Day to the office this week so they can be taken for engraving.
- Franklin Group Day—This is taking place at the A & P Showgrounds on Wednesday 15 October (please note change of date). Entry forms are available on the school website or from the office. Entries close this Thursday 9 October. The cost to enter is \$7.50. Entry is open to any child who showed a calf, lamb or goat at our Ag Day.
