SCHOOL DONATION SCHEME

This was our first year operating under the School Donation Scheme, and while it took a little getting used to, we believe it made a positive difference to our families in a tough economic climate.

* The national curriculum is set by the Ministry of Education. We have little leeway to personalise it hence our Local Curriculum Document. This was designed through information given to us by students, parents and staff over the last few years and is available on our school website. Our staff work hard to maintain a balance of supporting and encouraging each individual while also meeting the Ministry's requirements.

Buckland School Board Casual Vacancy for two Parent Representatives
