Reminders for home reading

- It should always be fun and achievable.
- Build confidence in their ability and praise their efforts
- Let the child hold and control the book.
- Talk about the stories before and after reading.
- DO NOT correct your child's errors immediately; give them a chance to use the strategies they are learning at school.
- Ask questions about the book.
- Read to your child, always and often.
- Be patient
- Make reading fun!!!



Reading at Home

- Do lots of talking about what the book may be about by looking at the pictures, predicting, what happens next, and retelling the story.
- Do ask questions like...what can you tell about the story from the pictures? What do you think might happen?
- Do discuss the pictures, encourage your child to build up the story before looking at the words.

- Read with your child (either taking turns or together).
