#### School Values

Our Literacy focus this term is on writing and presenting speeches. We will be doing a lot of work in class leading up to this and will send out information throughout the term about how your child can be supported at home to write and practise their speech. Speech finalists will be chosen from each class to share their speech at our final Team Assembly in Week 9. Families are invited to attend and hear the awesome speeches.

# Mathematics Teaching

As you are aware, in NZ we now have a revised Mathematics Curriculum and an additional resource called 'Maths - No Problem!" to support the implementation of this. After trialling this resource in Term 1, as a staff we have decided to change from teaching Maths in our composite classes, to teaching in year level groups. For our Team this means:

Year 3's will be with Miss Hari | Year 4's will be with Mrs Brachi | Year 5's will be with either Mrs King or Ms Tannion

Maths will be taught first thing in the morning from 9am - 10.10am so please make sure children arrive on time in the morning as they need to take the roll in their own class before heading off to Maths. If you have any questions about how this will work please see either your child's classroom teacher or their Maths teacher.

# Homework

The following homework expectations continue in Term 2:

- Daily reading (this could be a classroom reader, Library book, or book from home)
- Mathletics 10 mins of Course Work and 5 mins of 'Live' basic facts practise.



Speech writing will also be part of the homework requirements this term. Information from your child's classroom teacher will come home about this. We ask that during this time, speech writing becomes the priority and the above homework tasks are additional extras when the children have time.

We appreciate your continued support ensuring homework is completed each night, reading logs are signed and book bags come to school daily. Please encourage your child to be responsible and pack all of their homework each night ready to bring back to school the next day.

#### Life Education Caravan

We are lucky this term to have the Life Education Caravan visiting Buckland School. The Year 0-3/4 classes will be having two sessions during Week 7 with Harold the Giraffe on the theme: Healthy Eating. The Life Education Caravan will park in the teacher carpark next to Tui during its visit to Buckland School, so please be extra mindful when passing through this carpark while it is here.
