As we head into the final term of the year, our big focus with the children is on growing leadership. We are working hard to prepare our Year 4's to join the Senior Team next year, and our younger children to take over as leaders of the Middle Team in 2026.

This focus will see an even bigger emphasis put on the children taking ownership of their own learning, managing themselves and their belongings, putting their best effort into all and everything they do, and being prepared to give everything a go, even if it challenges you!

# Term 4 Learnina

This term, Kakapo are exploring *Water as a Taonga* and *Maramataka* – the M $_{ar{a}}$  ori lunar calendar. They will be learning how the water cycle works, how water is treasured and used, and how the moon affects our waterways. The Year 5s will deepen their learning at camp when they visit a M  $_{\bar{a}}$  ori P  $_{\bar{a}}$  site, and they'll share their new knowledge with the rest of the class when they return.

In Takahe and Kereru, we will be learning about *Te Ao Māori* — the M $_{ar{a}}$  ori world. We're exploring M  $_{ar{a}}$  ori stories, language, and performing arts like waiata and poi, and learning the tikanga (customs) that go with them. It helps our tamariki understand and value the special culture that makes Aotearoa unique.

Our P.E focus this term will be athletics skills as we prepare for our school Athletics Day in Week 4 and later in the term we hope to resume our daily swimming lessons - this is weather dependent and will be confirmed later in the term. A reminder that when swimming, all children must wear a rash vest to stay safe in the sun.
