When we travel to sports and events away from school we try to keep the cost of transport as low as possible. If we have a large group traveling we use a bus. The costing for the bus is worked out on every child travelling on the bus and it is expected that every child on the trip will pay towards the cost of the bus. The cost of a bus to Pukekohe and back is approximately \$250.

If we are able to use private transport we give parents a small donation towards the cost of running their car. Once again, every child on the trip is expected to pay towards the cost of transport including the driver's child/ren.

#### Hello everyone

My name is Marguerite Cooke. I hold a degree in counselling from the Manukau Institute of Technology and am working toward full registration with the New Zealand Association of Counsellors. I am a parent of two twenty-somethings.

I am privileged to be able to work at Buckland School one or two afternoons a week. I also work with children and adults at other venues, if this is more convenient.

Everyone has times when things get us down and life seems unusually hard and it's good to have someone to share our concerns with. Children often don't talk about things that are bothering them, and we might see only changes in their emotions and behaviour. I provide a safe, confidential space where children can express what's going on for them. I listen and work alongside children and their families to help bring about change. I welcome parent input.

Some of the issues that come up are: anxiety, depression, grief and loss, trauma, anger, family changes, bullying, and sibling conflict.

I love working with children and use a variety of activities to engage them, including clay, painting and drawing, games, small figures, and sandtray. For my own learning, I will ask for feedback.

I am now charging a fee for sessions. Please speak to me first, however, if you have any difficulties with this.
