Life Education Trust Mobile Classroom

Life Education lessons are given to the children using qualified teachers and modern technological equipment. The aim is to provide children in their formative years from 5-12 years with an awareness of themselves by getting to know the human body, how it functions and how and why it is affected by substances that upset its balance.

Life Education lessons link into the Schools Health Curriculum and each class has the opportunity to be involved in pre-visit and follow up activities.

We are keen that all children take part in the life Education lessons. We have arranged lessons for all classes in the Life Education Mobile classroom during the week starting Monday 4th July 2016

The cost per child for these lessons is: Year 1 – 6: \$5.00 Year 7 & 8: \$7.00

This is heavily subsidized by Life Education supporters and the school.
