Our latest May 2016 Report (find our full report here: <http://www.ero.govt.nz/review-reports/buckland-school-11-05-2016/>) gave Buckland School a very positive appraisal of our school; its processes and systems, its leadership, and importantly, the results being achieved by all our students.

The report and the reviewers were very complimentary about:

- The high percentage of students achieving National Standards

- Our success in the acceleration of progress for our Maori children, and all our children

- The proactive and constructive engagement with our school community and partnership with parents and whanau

- The role and involvement of the trustees in the governance of the school

- The strong pastoral care and emphasis on children's well-being and engagement.

The Board of Trustees, leadership team and staff are already working on the constructive recommendations the review officers made, such as continuing to foster good bicultural practices; and continuing to strengthen children's ownership of their learning.

In conclusion, the Board are very proud of the report and the great work Mavis and her staff are doing, and look forward to the next 4-5 years of continuous improvement from a very solid foundation.
