- ★ KELLY SPORTS SWIMMING LESSONS— These are continuing for this week on Thursdays and Fridays. Please ensure your children have their togs and a sweatshirt to put on after the lesson. The pool is heated and we would like all children to gain from all the lessons whereever possible.
- ◆ University of Canterbury—2018 Great Kiwi English, Science and Mathematics Competitions—are happening again this year for the second year. These are on-line tests for Year 5—10 students and are entirely voluntary. The supervised online tests will take place in the last 3 weeks of Term 2. There are costs involved which parents will need to meet. If you would like to enrol your child, forms are available on the noticeboard. Entries close this Wednesday 11 April.
- ◆ PTA AGM—This will be held this Tuesday 10 April. Nomination forms for President, Secretary and Treasurer must be received by the end of today Monday 9 April. Nomination form is on the back of this newsletter.
- Reporting to Parents—We have listened to your views concerning

reporting to parents on student progress and achievement and have made changes to the way we will do this, this year. In Term 1 we have held an initial meeting by teachers with parents. Early Term 2 we will hold Three way conferences to give your students and teachers the opportunity to share their learning with their families. At the end of Term 2 parents will receive individual reports (which this year will be a new format based on the curriculum levels to take into account the abolishment of National Standards). In Term 3 there will be an opportunity for parents to attend an open day and visit classes and observe students in their learning environments. At the end of Term 4 another individual report will be sent home. Parents need to be aware that you are always welcome to make a meeting with teachers to discuss your child's progress and achievements. At times teachers may also request these meetings. We hope these changes will address some of your views that were expressed during the recent community survey.


